RE Unit: Miraculous Escapes

Prior learning: building upon the learning from Jewish and Christian stories in KS1 – Moses and Daniel

1	What is a miracle?	 Daniel Around 600BCE some Israelites, including Daniel, were taken into exile by the Babylonians. Daniel was a high ranking Israelite & was taken into the King's palace. He impressed the King and was made a ruler. He obeyed God and prayed to Him. The Lion's Den Other rulers were jealous & plotted to get rid of him by tricking the king into agreeing to make a law that said that praying to anyone but the king was forbidden. Daniel continued to pray to God and the king reluctantly had to throw him into the lion's den. Angels kept him safe and in the morning the King released him, putting the tricksters in there instead. 	 Retrieval Using the clues work out the different characters from KS1 stories we have studied. Lesson Introduce the term "miraculous escapes" by asking children to reflect on own experiences or general knowledge of the term "narrow escape" e.g. a pet narrowly avoiding danger, a news story sugas trapped miners. 2	What happened to Daniel and his friends? THINKING	 Daniel and his friends are saved because of Daniel's faith and loyalty to God. Daniel and his friends refused to bow down to before the king. As Daniel and his friends were saved by God, the King told his subjects to follow God too. Vocabulary: Furnace, values/qualities, courage determination to do right, obedience, faith faithful, compassionate, miraculous things, loyalty, belief, trust 	RETRIEVAL What is a miracle? 3	Who was Moses and what happened in his early life?	Moses' childhood – young adulthood: Moses was an Israelite in Egypt. The Pharaoh was killing male baby Israelites when Moses born. His mother hid him in basket in bulrushes by River Nile. Sister, Miriam, was keeping watch over him. Princess saw him & wanted to keep him Miriam said she knew of someone who would look after him till 3yrs old –so mum cared for him, then took him to palace.	Retrieval Answer questions about the fiery furnace to recap the story LESSON T enter wearing a shawl & carrying a basket, in character as Moses' mother. T explains that the chn have to be quiet as there is a baby in the basket and people will be looking for her. Invite chn to ask	Videos: Prince of Egypt River Lullaby (baby Moses) Full opening scene Prince of Egypt Prince of Egypt – Moses kills Egyptian overseer

As young man, Moses saw an Egyptian hurting an Israelite so he killed him.

questions to T (hot seating) to elicit info on the early life of Moses

Watch video "Prince of Egypt River lullaby" – this short scene shows Moses' mother leaving the baby in the river, and the Pharaoh's wife finding him.

Listen to T explaining reason for Moses being placed in the basket – <u>use this article for further detail on the</u> <u>killing of slave first born males</u>

Watch "full opening scene Prince of Egypt". Now with context, chn can see why mother left baby.

Discuss: How would Moses react seeing Israelite slaves throughout his childhood?

Moses grew up knowing that he was different to his Egyptian brother, but as the queen mother took him in, he was accepted by all as royalty.

Watch "Prince of Egypt – Moses kills Egyptian overseer"

T explains that Moses ran away into the desert after this.

Recap/consolidate Moses hot seating – chn to take it in turns on groups to hot seat a Moses. All chn ot have Qs on whiteboards to ask, and T can encourage them to take on characters themselves e.g. asking questions as a member of Egyptian royalty, or an Israelite slave

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4	What miracles are told about Moses?	Burning bush Looked after sheep for 40yrs. saw burning bush, not unusual, except this one was not burning away. God asked him to remove shoes –holy place. Asked him to go and free the Israelites. Moses made many excuses – but God allowed him to take Aaron, his brother, with	Retrieval Moses in the bullrushes What do children remember about the story? Why is it a miracle? Introduce lesson by quickly recapping where we ended last week – Moses in desert, wandering without an aim / lost / confused / not feeling like he belongs anywhere.	Videos: Prince of Egypt plagues scene Prince of Egypt Red Sea scene
		Plagues God wanted Moses to return to the pharaoh's kingdom to free his people from slavery. Moses told Pharoah that if he did not let God's people go, God would punish him until they were free - the 10 plagues. Plagues included: water turning to blood, frogs, lice, flies, livestock pestilence, boils, hail, locusts, darkness and the killing of firstborn children. Israelites followed God's instructions in painting doorway with lamb's blood so the angel of death would 'pass over' them for the final plague Israelites had to flee, took unleavened bread (see Pesach festival) and crossed over as Red Sea parted. Sea closed together as Egyptians came. Vocabulary Plagues, obey Israelites Pharaoh slavery	Read the burning bush story What was the miracle? Discuss Discuss: 'Talking with Pharaoh and freeing Israelites from Egypt: What would the person need to be like?' use worksheet "Lesson 3 – Burning Bush" for chn to jot down ideas in pairs. follow with feedback / sharing ideas with class. Use slides up to slide 9 to discuss God choosing Moses for the job of saving the Israelites. Watch - "Prince of Egypt plagues scene"- understanding that God was very serious and would do anything to end his people's suffering. Show slide 11, and explain the final plague – killing of the first born. Allow for discussion time, as chn may find this part shocking / may have questions. Was this punishment too far? Was it even? Hadn't the pharaoh done the same thing when Moses was a young boy? Watch "Prince of Egypt Red Sea scene", showing the final miracle to discuss today. Independent/consolidation activity: charades with miracles from Moses life. Chn to play charades with events from Moses life. Write the event being acted out	

			on a whiteboard, and hide it from others in your group, so that the answer can be revealed at the end. Reflect on strengths and talents

God looked after the Israelites in the desert and gave them things to help them – light, food, fire God gave Moses the 10 commandments as a set of rules for Christians to live by. Vocabulary Journey Moses 10 commandments Israelites desert	Retrieval: Recap the journey of Moses so far – complete quiz Lesson Share info on what happened in the desert and God's love for the Israelites. What did they need? How did God look after them? Discuss the giving 10 commandments – Why were these important? What did they do? Task Which rules do you think are important today? Would you change any of the rules? What would you change them to? What was a miracle in the desert? What do Christians believe happened? Plenary What have we learnt about miraculous escapes in this topic?
